Lochcarron, Wester Ross



Attractive & comfortable 2-bedroom traditional Highland cottage with magnificent lochside views, close to all village amenities.



Located in the pretty village of Lochcarron and set amidst some of the most magnificent scenery in the Scottish Highlands, Tìgh na Creaga is a traditional 2-bedroom Highland stone cottage providing comfortable and homely accommodation for up to 4 people. All the front rooms have superb views to the south over the loch and there is a small decked garden area to the rear.

Tìgh na Creaga is not just a holiday cottage, it's also our home. We have refurbished and furnished the interior just as we would have wanted for ourselves, as we spend time there, too! So, please enjoy Tìgh na Creaga and all that Lochcarron and the surrounding area of north west Scotland has to offer.



The downstairs' accommodation comprises a comfortable sitting room with leather sofas, colour TV and a multi-fuel stove, and a good-sized kitchen/dining room with an oil-fired Rayburn which provides cooking, central heating and hot water. The Rayburn also ensures that the cottage is always warm and welcoming.. The dining table comfortably seats 4 people. A washing machine and fridge/freezer are also provided.

Upstairs, there are two bedrooms, both with views over the loch. The double bedroom has a king-size bed whilst the other bedroom has two single beds.

There is a bathroom with an electric shower over the bath and a separate WC..

There is adequate free parking in the parking bay just across the street from the cottage. The cottage is located in the centre of the village within easy (flat) walking distance of all amenities.

Well behaved dogs are welcome by prior arrangement. We regret that, for the benefit of other guests, we do not permit smoking inside the cottage.



Lochcarron is situated on the West Coast of Scotland, 63 miles due west of Inverness, and lies amidst magnificent Highland scenery, some of the finest in the British Isles.

To the right is a view of the village from the south shore of Lochcarron, with the snow-capped mountains of Applecross in the background.

Lochcarron is an excellent centre for touring. To the immediate north and west lies the Applecross peninsula which is approached via the Bealach na Ba, the Pass of the Cattle, one of the highest roads in Britain. This road climbs from sea level to a height of 2,053 feet, and provides some spectacular views along the way.



A 20-minute walk from the car park at the summit affords some even more magnificent views in all directions, especially towards the Isles of Skye and Raasay to the west. The photo to the left shows the view down towards Kishom from the Applecross tops.



A little further to the north and west are the Torridon Hills, always a favourite area for walkers and climbers, and the Beinn Eighe National Nature Reserve; also, beautiful Loch Maree, and Gairloch with its lovely white sandy beaches and links' golf course. Further north up the coast from Gairloch are Inverewe Gardens which, despite being on a latitude more northerly than Moscow, contain exotic plants from all over the world, courtesy of the Gulf Stream.

To the south and west are Loch Alsh and the new Skye Bridge, and the magnificent scenery of Glenelg (with its Pictish brochs) and Kintail. The road over to Glenelg via Mam Ratagan provides, once again, some very spectacular views. Nearer to Lochcarron are the pretty villages of Shieldaig and Plockton, and the gardens at Attadale just across the loch. Lochcarron is surrounded by excellent walking country with many magnificent views.

3 miles from Lochcarron is Strome Castle (see right) and North Strome where the old Strome Ferry used to cross the Strome Narrows. Prior to the opening of the A890 Strome Ferry Bypass road along the south shore of Loch Carron in the late 1960's, this ferry provided the route into Lochcarron from the south and west. Nowadays, the only remaining evidence of the ferry are the slipways on either side and the place name - with a sign saying "Stromeferry - No Ferry"!

- In order to place a booking, we require a completed Booking Form together with payment of the appropriate deposit. Payment in full is required at the time of booking if there are less than 6 weeks remaining until the start of your holiday.

- You are advised to contact us in the first instance to check on the availability of the dates you require. If you wish to proceed with a booking, we will forward a Booking form by post for completion and return.

Tigh na Creaga is located on the Main Street of Lochcarron village. The photo above shows the view looking south west from Croft Road, just above the Main Street, and gives an indication of the position of our cottage, close to the shore.

Lochcarron is reached from the south by one of two main routes:-

- A9 north from Inverness, thence via the A835 to Garve, the A832 to Achnasheen, and finally the A890/A896 to Lochcarron.
- From Fort William via the A82 north to Invergarry, and then via the A87 (towards Kyle of Lochalsh) and the A890/A896 to Lochcarron.
